SAMPLE TEXT

Included Hardware:

Expedition One Rocker Guards (one driver & one passenger side) 18.5" Stainless Steel Treads 11.5" Stainless Steel Treads (4 dr only) (12) 3/8" x 1 1/4" GR 8 ZP Hex Cap Bolt (12) 3/8" USS GR 8 ZP Flat Washer (12) GR5 ZP Spring Nut/Standard 16 Threadpitch (12) 5/16" x 18 x 3/4" GR 5 ZP Hex Cap Bolt <u>(12) 5/16" x 18 GR 5 ZP Finish Nut</u> <u>(12) 5/16" USS GR 8 Flat Washer</u>

<u>Tools:</u>

Drill with 1/2" bit and 3/8" bit Socket set and allen wrenches

Skill Level:

3/5 stars (Professional install recommended)



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First remove the stock Rubicon Sliders. The stock sliders have 2 bolts on the pinch seam and one on the under side of the body in 3 places. If your vehicle is not equipped with sliders, skip to the next step, however, mmore drilling may be required in the pinch seam of the body in order to moun the sliders.

- 1. INSTALL TREAD PLATES: Lubricate the buttonhead socket bolts and install the tread plates into the integrated nuts. Tighten only until firm. Over-tightening could damage the stainless steel and lead to rust-ing around the bolt. If your tread hardware kit came with nuts you won't need them.
- 2. Next, Identify the areas on the bottom of the vehicle for drilling. If you removed an OEM slider, use those holes now. You may need to drill them out with the 3/8" bit and you will need to drill additional holes. See (steps 3 & 4). The slider can be heavy so you may want a friend to help you lift it in place for this step. Put the slider in place and secure it with one bolt up front and one in the back of thee pinch seam. Then line up the holes in the slider with the existing factory mounts that you will be reusing on the bottom side of the body. If you did not have stock sliders, you will need to hold the slider in place while you mark to drill all the holes.
- 3. Now mark the locations for drilling on the bottom body side of the body. There are 6 areas per side where holes must be drilled on the bottom of the vehicle. Mark the drill hole through the oval hole in the slider and then remove the slider and prepare for drillig.
- 4. Use the 1/2" bit to drill the holes. Once the holes are drilled, clean up the holes and insstall the retainer clips needed for mounting.

With the retainer clips in place, mount the sliders. Make sure to put all the bolts on loosely and then tighten all bolts after they are all in place.
